

## Monday's Homework

1. Write the date at the top of the page. (One page per day.)
2. Write each weekly word on the blank grid sent home with the newsletter. (Check for this week's words on your first grade newsletter.) Save for Wednesday's homework.
3. Using the "Phonics Focus" from the newsletter, sort the words at least 2 ways. Record your sorts in your Homework Notebook.
4. Write a sentence telling what you read tonight. This could be from your reading bag, the library, or from your own collection. (Example: I read The Three Bears and The Very Hungry Caterpillar with my Dad." **Remember 20 minutes worth!** 😊)

## Wednesday's Homework

1. Write the date at the top of the page. (One page per day.)
2. No weekly word work.
3. Write a sentence telling what you read tonight. (This could be from your reading bag, the library, or from your own collection.) **Remember 20 minutes worth!**
4. Review all papers in "take home" folder.

## Tuesday's Homework

1. Write the date at the top of the page. (One page per day.)
2. Write your words in your Homework Notebook.
3. Look for chunks (Check the "Phonics Focus" on your first grade newsletter for this week's chunk.) Box, underline or circle the chunk in each word with a pencil or crayon.
4. Write a sentence telling what you read tonight. This could be from your reading bag, the library, or from your own collection. (Example: I read Good Night Moon and The Three Little Pigs to my sister.) **Remember 20 minutes worth!** 😊)
4. Review all papers in "take home" folder.

## Thursday's homework

1. Write the date at the top of the page. (One page per day.)
2. Using your word cards from Monday's homework, cut each word apart into individual letters and mix them up. Then glue the words back together correctly in your Homework Notebook.
3. Write a sentence telling what you read tonight. (This could be from your reading bag, the library, or from your own collection.) **Remember 20 minutes worth!**
4. Review all papers in "take home" folder.
