<sup>2</sup> The Early Learning Challenge Fund is a new initiative and has no previous funding history. NOTE: Included in the House Student Loan Reconciliation Bill (H.R., 3221, "The Student Aid and Fiscal Responsibility Act) is \$1 billion in FY 2010 for the Early Learning Challenge Fund. H.R. 3221 was approved by the House Education and Labor Committee on July 21, 2009, but must become federal law before funding is provided.

<sup>3</sup> The President's Budget Request would double the funding of the "Striving Readers" program, but allocate the funds to "Adolescent Literacy Grants," and a new "Early Literacy Grants" program.

<sup>4</sup> Reflecting changes from the 2008 reauthorization of the Higher Education Act, the President's Budget Request replaces the Teacher Quality Enhancement Grants with the Teacher Quality Partnership Program.

<sup>5</sup> Spending on the AC, SMART and TEACH Grants is mandatory, and left largely unaddressed by the decisions of appropriations committees, much like federal student loan programs. Each of these programs will be operated in such a way that any applicant that satisfies the programs' requirements will receive the aid for which they are eligible.

<sup>6</sup> NOTE: Included in the House Student Loan Reconciliation Bill (H.R., 3221, "The Student Aid and Fiscal Responsibility Act) is \$600 million in FY 2010 for the College Access and Completion Fund. H.R. H.R. 3221 was approved by the House Education and Labor Committee on July 21, 2009, but must become federal law before funding is provided.
